# SOMETHING TO PONDER BY REV BRITT

"What is your favorite song about Love?"

Notice I didn't ask for your favorite love-song? When I think about love-songs my mind automatically goes to "Love, Love Me Do," by the Beatles. "Love, love me, do, You know I love you, So pleaase, love me do!"

A song about love, ,as opposed to a love song, is not the same as "Love, love me, do."

Try googling "Songs about Love" in your web browser and you will get a long list of love-songs about falling in love, falling out of love, breaking up, and unrequited love. But finding songs *about love* seems to be rather rare. There's "Love is a rose you better not pick it." Which is not quite what I have in mind. I am thinking about songs which talk about love as a virtue that transcends all songs.

Perhaps I am mistaken, but I think we are often muddled about what love itself is. I am also not sure we recognize what Jesus meant when he said, "Love one another as I have loved you." When Jesus talked about love, he was talking about making love itself, and not a desire to occupy another person's life as a focus. He showed us love by serving, helping, healing, risking, sacrificing, including, celebrating, forgiving. He acted out the meaning of love by washing his disciples' feet. Love like that is deep and wide. It is about abiding with an other, taking their part, mutually sharing their burdens, entering into their joy. It is as much if not more about what one gives away, as it is about what one receives.

In a world which sings love is deep and wide. It sings by the thousands, finding love as Jesus himself embodied it is rare. Yet he also loved so that we may learn how to love like that ourselves. And then hopefully go on to tell about it to others.

# FINANCE CORNER - Update as of February 2024

Financial results for the first two months of 2024 are quite encouraging. Here are the year-to-date highlights compared to budget as of February 29th:

**Net Income** (total income less total expenses) We essentially broke even versus a budgeted loss of \$20,200

**Income** (revenue) \$3300 more than budgeted with Local Envelopes +\$2900 and Rentals +\$1300.




